## **Reflection:**

Following from last week's word of assurance, today's readings continue in an attitude of comfort, emphasising God's nearness and God's strengthening of those who struggle. In Athens Paul speaks to the people of the city about a God who can be known and "in whom we live, move and have our being." He invites them to recognise that God is very near to all people whether they are aware of God or not. The Psalmist reflects on God's presence even during times of 'testing' and gives thanks for God's rescue and forgiveness, and celebrates that God does indeed hear the prayers of God's people. In Peter's letter the apostle continues to offer comfort to a persecuted church assuring them that they are following in Christ's nail-scarred footsteps, and that in Christ they are saved. And, in John's Gospel, Jesus offers the promise of the Spirit, assuring his disciples that by the Spirit they will always know that God is with them and in them, and they will enjoy the love relationship that Jesus has given them. The wonderful, challenging and comforting message of this week is that God is intimately available to us, and that God's presence and resources are accessible to us as we face the challenges and struggles of following Christ and living fully. The question this raises to each one of us to ponder is whether we are willing to embrace God's presence, and rest in God's strength especially in the world situation we live in right now, when we are faced with many unimaginable challenges in our daily lives.

Risen Christ, by the lakeside you renewed your call to your disciples: help us to obey your command and draw others to the fire of your love. Amen.
