Birthdays: Marjorie 11th **Reflection:** The festival season (Easter, Ascension, Pentecost and Trinity) has ended and we have now entered into the season of Ordinary. This season is often highlighted with the colour Green. This season of Ordinary is a time and opportunity for each one of us to move on and deepen our understanding of Jesus and God.

This week there are two elements to all of the readings. All of the readings speak in some way about God's election of God's people. God chooses people to partner with God, to be God's own treasured possession, and to experience God's promise, God's presence, and God's love. But they also speak about how this choosing is not for the sake of those who are chosen. God's choice of the Israelites, of the disciples, and of all who follow Jesus' way is for the sake of those who will come to know God's grace and love through them. The clear call of this week, then, is for us to be a people who respond to God's choosing by partnering with God in sharing the values, priorities, and purposes of God's kingdom with our world. But there is something we have to understand too. When we accept God's invitation, God's choosing of us, we have to know that it won't be just lovely and perfect all the time, rather with it comes suffering and sometimes even persecution. This is harsh reality we have to be ready to face, as by following Jesus' way means being at odds with the society around us. But it also means that whenever we find ourselves being misunderstood or questioned or challenged, we have an opportunity to share the message of Jesus and to demonstrate God's love and grace through our actions.

God of truth, help us to keep your law of love and walk in the ways of wisdom, that we may find true life in Jesus Christ your Son. Amen.
