Reflection:

This week we hear and read in Paul's letter how the followers of Christ are called to embrace the life that is found in righteousness. This idea is then further clarified by Jesus' teaching that receiving, welcoming, and providing hospitality for even the least is how 'righteousness' is lived and expressed. Therefore, the word 'welcoming' may be a simple summary of this week's theme -God's welcoming for us, and our welcome for one another in God's name.
