Third Sunday of Lent

The Tower of Siloam

In today's Gospel reading Jesus talks about two different disasters, the deaths of an unknown number of Galileans killed by Pilate, and 18 people killed when the tower of Siloam fell on them. Jesus points out that neither of these disasters had anything to do the the sin of the people involved, they just happened. And then he emphasises the importance of repentance for all of us, so we too don't perish.



Martin Luther talked about repentance being all about turning, that if we **turn away** from God towards sin we need to **turn back** to God for his grace and forgiveness. The season of Lent is a fitting time to consider how we might have developed sinful habits or ways of thinking that get in the way of us fully receiving God's grace. Why not spend some time alone with God and ask the Holy Spirit to shows us those areas where we have fallen short of the glory of God; **turn to him** and ask for his forgiveness and grace to wash us clean.
